

I. Course of Fire (Fifty (50) round minimum)

The course of fire shall be determined by the instructor. Provisions may be made for persons with physical disabilities which precludes them from firing from a standing or two-handed position. Instructors may also choose alternate hand positions, movement, reloading sequence and the number of rounds expended per cycle.

1. Review the Range Commands.

1. MAKE THE LINE READY
2. THE LINE IS READY
3. FIRE
4. CEASE-FIRE.
5. MAKE THE LINE SAFE.
6. THE LINE IS SAFE.
7. (Repeat)

(ALL students and instructors must wear approved eye & ear protection)

2. Three (3) yard line (20 rounds)

- a. On command, the students shall load their handgun with the number of rounds specified by the instructor.
- b. On command, the students will open the cylinder or pull back the slide, unload the handgun and verify the handgun is unloaded. No student shall move from one firing line to another with a loaded handgun.

3. Five (5) yard line (20 rounds)

- a. On command, the students shall load their handgun with the number of rounds specified by the instructor.
- b. On command, the students will open the cylinder or pull back the slide, unload the handgun and verify the handgun is unloaded. No student shall move from one firing line to another with a loaded handgun.

4. Seven (7) yard line (10 rounds).

- a. On command, the students shall load their handgun with the number of rounds specified by the instructor.
- b. On command, the students will open the cylinder or pull back the slide, unload the handgun and verify the handgun is unloaded. No student shall move from one firing line to another with a loaded handgun.

5. Upon completion, the instructor shall inspect every student's handgun and insure it is unloaded and safe. The empty weapon will be placed and secured in a case or holster before leaving the firing line. No live ammunition or handguns are allowed in the classroom (certified instructors excluded).

J. Scoring Targets

1. Hits within the 7 ring line (or on the line) will be counted as two points.
2. Hits outside the 7 ring but within the silhouette will be counted as one (1) point.
3. The final score will be calculated by multiplying the number of hits by the appropriate points specified. A composite score of 70% must be achieved to pass the range portion of the course.
4. Students are given one opportunity to pass both the written and range portion of the course. If the student is unsuccessful on either portion they must retake the entire safety course. Remedial training may be given prior to range qualification; however, once the qualification course is fired no additional training or re-qualification is allowed.
5. Range scores must be recorded on the written test answer sheet and on the Class Roster.
